## HALLOWEEN PARADE

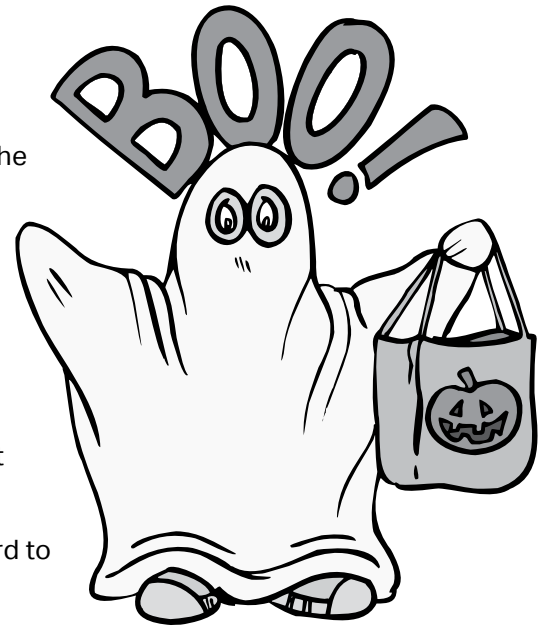
### Sunday, October 30th

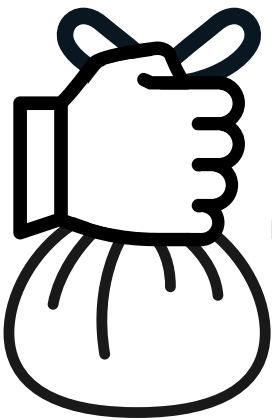
